## FOCUS (1/2)

### International Conference of Independent Publishers in Fez (Morocco) in 2027

The next conference will take place in Fez (Morocco) in November 2027. The meeting of the International Committee of Independent Publishers in 2025 thus focused on the organisation of this next major event for independent publishing. For 3 days, the coordinators of the Alliance's language networks and the Moroccan publisher En toutes lettres (who put forward Fez as the venue for the next Alliance conference) built the conference programme based on the proposals/ expectations of the members consulted in 2024.

The pre-programme of the Conference will be available in the next few months.

All the activities undertaken in 2025 and those to come in 2026 will feed into the process of building the Conference and contribute to the reflections and recommendations that will emerge from the Conference. One of the priorities for 2026 and 2027 will be to set up partnerships (in terms of content, logistics, finance, etc.) to ensure the success of the Conference.

### Governance

A consultation process on the organisation/ operation/ governance of the Alliance will take place between March and September 2026 with the Alliance members; feedback from members will be compiled and analysed at the ICIP meeting in October 2026. The findings of this consultation will be discussed during the Conference 2027, where a session will be dedicated to the governance of the Alliance.

# FOCUS 2/2

## Promotion of unique intercultural materials from the Bibliodiversity Observatory & Babelica

The various working areas of the Alliance, whether the [Bibliodiversity Observatory](#) or [Babelica](#), are coherent and complementary to each other. Babelica's programme is based on the themes explored by the Bibliodiversity Observatory (book ecology, freedom to publish, public book policies, digitalisation/ AI, etc.). The material resulting from the Babelica round tables and workshops, like the analyses and tools produced within the Bibliodiversity Observatory, is comprehensive: it includes over a hundred testimonies/ interventions/ proposals from all over the world. This material is unique: based on intercultural exchanges, it gives priority to seldom-heard voices that are often in the minority; it proposes themes that are not often addressed at the international level... All this material is organised thematically on several platforms, to make them more accessible: [YouTube](#), [Babelica](#), the [Bibliodiversity Observatory \(Alliance website\)](#).

The period leading up to the conference (2026–2027) will provide an opportunity for Alliance members, professionals, academics and public authorities to review and build on this material, and to (re)engage with it.

## Solidarity

In October 2024, the members of the Alliance decided to create a space of solidarity with book professionals in Palestine, to promote and encourage the circulation of Palestinian texts across continents, and to make the voice of book professionals in Palestine heard.

This space is flexible and will take different formats:

- In June 2025, Arabic-speaking publishers (including Palestinian publishers) and French-speaking publishers gathered in [Tunis for meetings organised by the Alliance](#) to present titles from their catalogue on Palestine, with a view to exchanging rights (transfer of rights, co-publications, translations).

During Babelica, on 24 and 25 September 2025:

- [Readings of Palestinian texts by Palestinian authors were offered by the Alliance's Arabic-language network](#);
- A [round-table](#) discussion with Palestinian book professionals;
- A [selection of titles on Palestine was showcased](#) to encourage the transfer of rights, co-publishing and translation projects.

### Prospects for 2026

- Add to the database of Palestinian texts and promote it (for worldwide distribution in all languages);
- Continue to showcase Palestinian voices at the 2026 edition of Babelica and at the International Conference of Independent Publishers in 2027.

#### Plans for 2026 and 2027

- Updating the mapping of public book policies in French-speaking Africa/ Madagascar and Latin America
- Fundraising to develop a mapping of public book policies in English-speaking Africa

- Round tables (online) on the freedom to publish during the Babelica edition (September 2025)

- Work on the 2027 Conference, where the issue of freedom to publish will be one of the main themes

### Guide to Good Practice ([click here](#))

The Guide to Good Practice is a practical version of the Pamplona-Iruñea Declaration "For a decolonial, ecological, feminist, free, social and united independent publishing", written collectively by the members of the Alliance. The Guide's content will be one of the main themes in the run-up to the 2026–2027 Conference.

### Development of a logo/ label (visual variation) for the Guide to Good Practice

Produced by the Alliance's Spanish-language network, this logo/ label has a dual purpose: to inform readers about the work of independent publishing houses, and to demonstrate their commitment to ecological, decolonial, social, and solidarity-based publishing. It will first be tested within the Spanish-language network before being adopted more widely by independent publishers.

## Book fairs for independent publishers

### Babelica

#### Report on the 2025 edition

- 77 participating independent publishers from 42 countries represented (including 5 newcomers: Niger, USA, Taiwan, Ukraine, Zimbabwe)
- more than 205 titles
- 10 round tables, 1 rights market and 5 readings over 2 days / 4 events with interpretation in 3 languages (French, English and Spanish); 2 events with interpretation in 2 languages (English and Arabic)
- 54% increase in the number of visitors = + 2,116 visitors in 2025 (compared with 1,372 visitors in 2024)

#### Highlights of the 2025 edition

- Themed programming: Palestine, Freedom to publish, Public book policies
- A more concise, more readable programme
- The rights market is becoming an important meeting place for publishers – and a unique and singular space in terms of connections between independent publishing houses


#### The next Babelica will be held on 21 and 22 September 2026

- Support in setting up the rights markets and co-publications ([click here](#))





